BIBLE LAND PASSAGES: EXPLORING ISRAEL & ROME

Examining the Land and the Book: A Passageway to Faith, Education, and Edification

Day One - Depart Newark, NJ - Time TBD

Day Two – Arrive at Tel Aviv and travel through the ancient tribal territories of Judah and Simeon. Depending on arrival time, we will travel to the Biblical Negev where Abraham sojourned and walk in the steps of the patriarchs. Visit the ancient tel of Beersheba and learn about the early water systems described in the Bible of both the Bronze and Iron Age eras. Stop at a scenic overlook for our evening worship service. Enjoy a delicious dinner at the Dead Sea. **Overnight at the Dead Sea** (*Dinner Provided*).

Day Three – After watching the sun rise over the mountains of Moab, we will visit the traditional site of King David's stronghold and what would later become known as Masada, where King Herod built a huge desert fortress overlooking the Dead Sea. Leaving Masada, our next destination will be Khirbet Qumran, the site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered, and then it's on to Jericho, the oldest city in the world. From here we will travel up the Ascent of Adumin (the old Jericho road) stopping to read a Psalm of Ascent at the Wadi Qelt. From there it's on to Mt. Scopus for personal reflection and thought before entering the city of Jerusalem. Overnight in Jerusalem (Breakfast and Dinner Provided)




Day Four – This will be a special day for visiting the geopolitically important area of the Shephelah. This narrow section of foothills is wedged between the ancient sites belonging to the Philistines and the terraced farmland of the Judean Hill Country. This area is rich with Old Testament history involving Samson, Ark of the Covenant, David and Goliath, Micah, the Kings of Judah, and the Invasion of Sennacherib at Lachish. The morning will be very busy with stops at Beth Shemesh and the Valley of Elah. Our afternoon plans will include visits to the Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial as well as Israel's most prestigious Museum of Archaeology, which includes an impressive outdoor model of first century Jerusalem and the Shrine of the Book where many of the Dead Sea Scrolls are preserved.

Overnight in Jerusalem. (Breakfast and Dinner Provided).

Day Five - Our day will begin with a tour of the excavations south of the Temple Mount. We will walk on streets from the time of Christ and sit near the place where the first century church first assembled. You will also step into ancient baptistries, see the remains of first century buildings, and visit the ruins of buildings and towers from the time of King

Solomon. From here we will proceed north and visit the famed Western Wall, the Western Wall Tunnels, and emerge near the first-century pool of Bethesda where our group will sing in the acoustically phenomenal church of St. Anne. After walking along the traditional Via Dolorosa, we will stop for lunch in the Jewish quarter and then proceed on to the ancient City of David. Here, we will see the remains of a large stone palace structure, walk underground to the Jebusite fortress, travel through Hezekiah's tunnel, and visit the pool of Siloam. Overnight in Jerusalem (Breakfast and Dinner Provided).



Day 6 - This day will be devoted to walking in the steps of Jesus during His passion. Our day begins with a breathtaking view of the Old City of Jerusalem, including Mount Moriah and the Dome of the Rock from atop the Mount of Olives. We will walk near the path that Jesus took as He wept over the city of Jerusalem upon His triumphal entry, then make our way to the Garden of Gethsemane where we will see olive trees that are hundreds of years old. Here we will read the scriptures of Jesus' prayer and arrest, and take time for personal reflection. Next we will stop at the Kidron Valley, consider the night of His betrayal, and move along to Gallicantu, the proposed site for the home of Caiaphas. This emotional trek will also take us to the other proposed sites for His trial, crucifixion, and resurrection. We will stop at the

Hidden Gate, the Citadel, the Church of the Holy Sepulcher, and the Garden Tomb. It will be a transformative and powerful day. **Overnight in Jerusalem** (*Breakfast and Dinner provided*).

Day 7 – A busy day of sightseeing and travel will begin with an early departure to visit the ancient site of Shiloh where

God's tabernacle once stood. From here we will travel to the ancient Roman and Byzantine city of Scythopolis at Beth She'an. From the top of Beth She'an we can look out over the Harod valley and see Byzantine, Egyptian, and Roman ruins, and Trans-Jordan, and gaze upon on Mount Gilboa where King Saul met his death. Our journey will take us along the base of Mount Tabor, near numerous well-known biblical sites. Our day will end at Magdala Archaeological park where we will see a first century synagogue and examine the ruins of a city in existence during the time of Jesus. Overnight near the Sea of Galilee (Breakfast and Dinner Provided).



Day 8 - Awaken to the picturesque scenery surrounding the Sea of Galilee and begin the day on a scenic boat ride across the lake where Jesus once walked and to the place where he calmed the storm. Visit the first century "Jesus Boat" museum at Ginnosaur and then take a scencic trip along the Sea of Galilee observing the environs and unique topography of its coast and surrounding mountains. Following lunch we will visit a first century synagogue at Migdal, and then travel to Capernaum to walk among the ruins where Jesus made his home during his public ministry in the region of Galilee, followed by a visit to the traditional site for the Sermon on the Mount. Overnight near the Sea of Galilee (Breakfast and Dinner Provided).



Day 9 Tues — Begin the day in prayer near the Sea of Galilee as you imagine Jesus walking on the water some 2000 years ago. After breakfast, view the impactful vista on Mt Arbel overlooking the Sea of Galilee and take time to remember the sermon Jesus preached on the Mount. Travel along the Huleh Basin on our way to visit Hazor where we will see the ruins of Caananite, Egyptian and Israelite settlements. From here we will travel north to Tel Dan, where a powerful lesson will be learned at the remains of an altar built by Jereboam, and where we will observe some of the sites of the most important archaeological discoveries in northern Israel. Then it's on to the ruins of Caesarea Philippi (Banias) where Jesus made the promise to establish His church. We will walk along the beautiful headwaters of the Jordan River,

and make one final stop along the heights of Golan, taking in the vistas of Mount Hermon and the road to Damascus. **Overnight near the Sea of Galilee** (*Breakfast and Dinner Provided*).

Day 10 Wed – Travel near the Mt. Carmel range on our way to Bet She'arim, if time permits, we will visit the Jewish Catacombs of the Roman period where we will learn about Rabbinic Judaism. Enjoy identifying the various historically significant mountaintops and valleys of the biblical world as we make our way to the ancient port city of Caesarea, the capital of Judea under the Romans. Visit the excavations of this ancient city and see where Paul made his defense before Festus and King Agrippa prior to his final journey to Rome. We will visit the ancient hippodrome, harbor, and theater of the Roman and Byzantine periods. You will also see the remains of an ancient crusader fortress. From here we will make our way to Ben Gurion International airport to board a flight to beautiful and historic Rome. Overnight in Rome (Breakfast Provided)





Day 11 Thur – After breakfast, travel by bus to Vatican City and spend the morning walking through one of the largest museums in the world. Learn more about the history of Catholicism, see magnificent art treasures, view archaeological discoveries relating to the Bible, enter St. Peter's Basilica, walk through the incredible map room, and visit the historic Sistine Chapel. Our afternoon will include a walking tour through some of the most iconic and familiar sites of Rome. We will see the Trevi Fountain, the Spanish Steps, and the beautiful Piazza Navona. A highlight of the tour will include a visit to the historic Pantheon, one of the most influential and well-preserved buildings of ancient Rome. Overnight in Rome (Breakfast Provided).

Day 12 – Waking up in historic Rome is exciting. While the sounds of a busy city will be heard all around, your awareness of its enthralling and storied history will soon become clear as you make your way to Rome's most iconic site—the Colosseum. This ancient stadium was used for more than four centuries for Roman entertainment including gladiator fights, wild animal fights, large mock combat engagements, and much more. As we are led by expert Italian guides in Roman history, imagine the horrific events that took place inside the Colosseum. From there we will visit the splendid Arch of Constantine, the biblically significant Arch of Titus, the Roman Forum, and Palatine Hill. Our day will include a devotional at the Circus Maximus where numerous Christians lost their lives because they would not renounce the faith nor deny the name of Jesus. Our day will conclude with a visit to San Sebastiano Catacombs. Overnight in Rome (Breakfast Provided).





Day 13 Depart Rome and Arrive Newark Same Day

There is no way to adequately describe what traveling to the Bible Lands will you do for you, both spiritually and educationally. To sing, pray, and study at various sites where heroes of faith once stood is thrilling and edifying. You will walk in the footsteps of both Jesus and Paul, and your life will be forever changed. Our highly unique program is designed to bring color, clarity, and a deeper understanding of the many customs, words, and practices of the people and settings of the Bible story and its historical and geographical context. Terms and Conditions

<u>Vaccine Requirements:</u> As of this writing, whether or not a Vaccination Passport (or something similar) will be required has not yet been revealed by Israel or Rome. Much debate between governmental agencies has surrounded this issue and is yet to be determined and resolved.

<u>Eligible Participants:</u> To safeguard the security and intent of the Bible Land Tour program, unless otherwise stated, the following rules apply to be eligible for participation in a Bible Land Passage tour.

- 1. Be a member of the church. (References may be required).
- 2. Be 12 years of age or older.
- 3. Those under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult family member, legal guardian, or have special permission from the Tour Directors to attend. For a minor under the age of 18, to travel outside of the US without either both parents or legal guardians, a notarized affidavit must be obtained and presented to airport or governmental officials upon departure and return to Singapore.
- 4. Must have a valid passport not expiring within six months of departure date.
- 5. Must agree to the terms and conditions as outlined on the registration documents
- 6. Must agree to abide by the principles of conduct as outlined in the New Testament.
- 7. Meet the health and physical disabilities criteria outlined below

Space is limited. To maximize the travel and tour experience, and to keep cost affordable, a minimum and maximum number of passengers is set between 35 and 50. For ease of travel and to expedite moving from place to place with land transportation, we need to limit our packing to one small (preferably) size suitcase per person, and to one small carry-on and/or backpack (or if you are a Rick Steves fan, then limit all your luggage to just one carry-on and backpack). Baggage handling for one standard size suitcase per person is included in the price. Due to limited motor coach capacity, this bag should have dimensions not exceeding 62 linear inches (length + width + height; including wheels and handles) and weight not exceeding 50 lbs. Carry-on bags are the responsibility of the passengers. One carry-on and one personal item are allowed. Dimensions for carry-on bags are not to exceed 9" X 14" X 22" inches.
